Attendance

In this newsletter we have spoken about how parents can support the school. This is one very crucial area. Attendance is a real concern at Dallington. The target the Government set schools is 96% attendance, last year we were on 94% and at various times throughout the year we were even lower. We have several schemes running in school but it is not the children who decide to book holidays so I do feel a little bad that the attendance schemes rewards good attendance but sometimes the children are not to blame. Bad attendance can lead to repercussions for the school, your child missing out on education and important time with their friends.
