One-way system – car park

Just a reminder that to try and ease the congestion of traffic around morning and afternoon pick up we ask the following;

- Please drive down the hill in the morning (towards the church)

- **DO NOT AT ANY TIME- PARK ON THE ZIG ZAGS** this limits an already tight road and cuts down on visibility for those crossing.

- The bus stop can be used for parking in **THE MORNING** but not the afternoon.



We have updated the school policy and it will be live on the school website next week. This 'poster' gives you an overview of the changes.




