# <u>Uniform</u>

We try to be flexible with uniform but every now and then I believe we need to send a reminder. If you are still unsure after this the uniform policy is on the school website. Children should not be wearing trainers to school – unless it is Thursday for PE, a school jumper is that as school jumper not a hoody or a top that has a little bit of green on the collar. PE kit is shorts and a white tee shirt – not the latest football top or anything else. The policy is readily available and has been for the last 5 years - please ensure your child is wearing the correct clothes to school – I am more than happy for them to wear the second-hand uniform if they persist on wearing their own clothes.

### <u>Opera</u>

We again had the opportunity for a group of children and parents to experience an opera at the world-famous Glyndebourne. Not only did the get to experience the venue but it was a world premier of this opera which had been especially written for children. It was a wonderful experience – we have received so much positive feedback from not only the families but the venue as well!



### **Snacks**

Whilst I am in a moany mood snacks need to be looked at. Again, our policy is clearly on our website — we — as a school have not changed our approach! Children are allowed to bring 1 (yes 1 item) to school for snack. 1 item should be a snack — not a family sized pack of crisps — not sweets or anything else! The children are eating three or four things, all of which are unhealthy! We run tuck shop on a Tuesday and Thursday — there is always fruit available. If we continue to see children ignoring school rules we will simply ban all snacks except the school-based fruit and

### First aid

By the time you read this we would have had two classes learn first aid. The remaining two classes will have their training on Friday. Mini Medics came in and worked with the children teaching them how to put someone in the recovery position, how to check someone's airway, how to call an ambulance and how to use a defibrillator. I believe that this work they covered is a life skill – hopefully one they never have to use but it is always good to be prepared!

On Monday we sent a message out about the fire we had in the library. It has been a whirlwind of a few days but just as an update. It appears that one of the heaters in the library had a catastrophic melt down, it literally melted! The heat and melting plastic/electrics caused a huge plume of smoke to engulf the Library.
